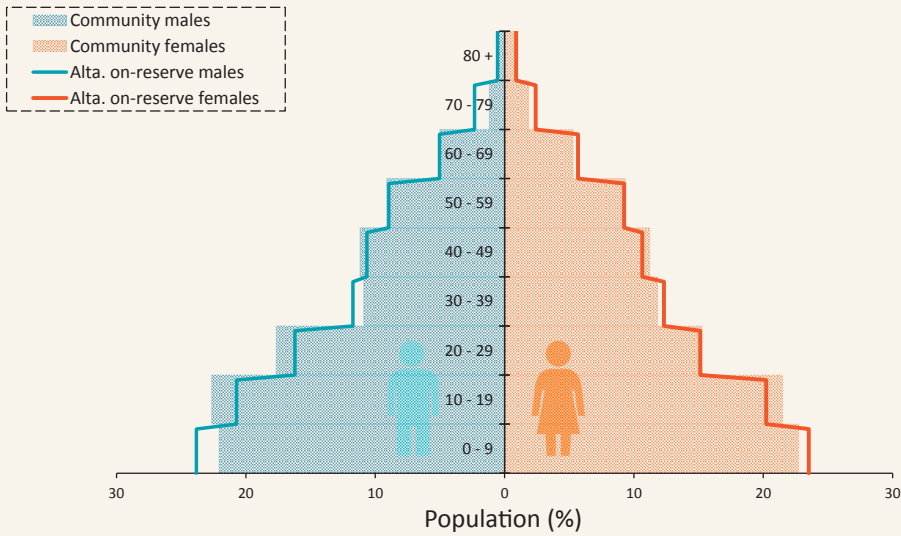

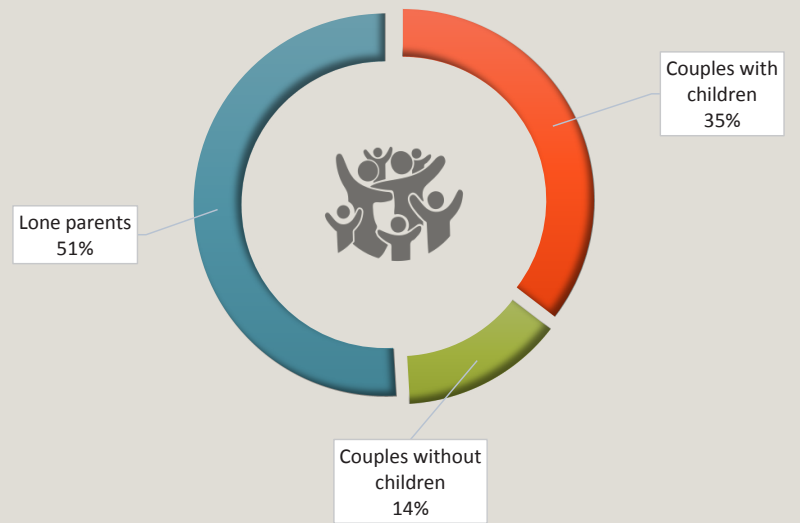

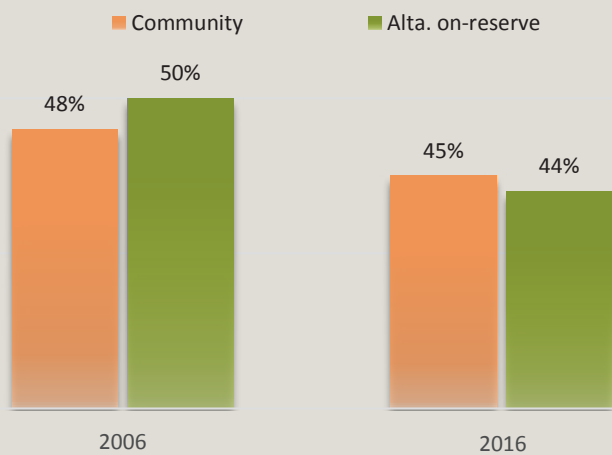
### AGE & SEX DISTRIBUTION



### FAMILY STRUCTURE<sup>4</sup>

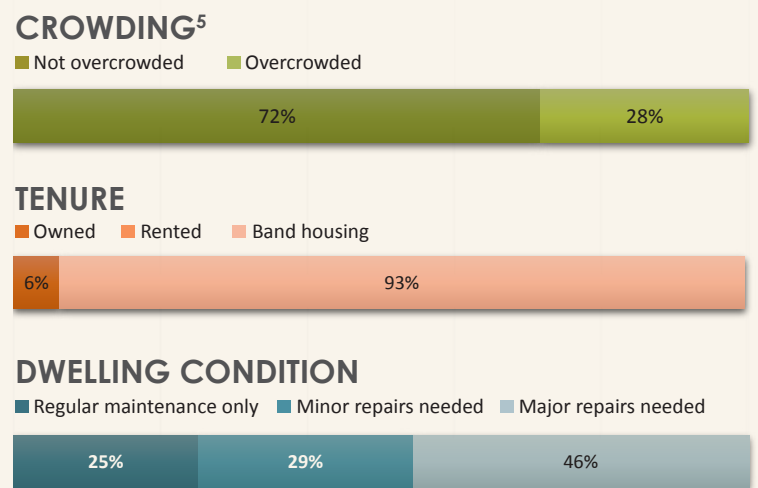


### KNOWLEDGE OF ABORIGINAL LANGUAGES



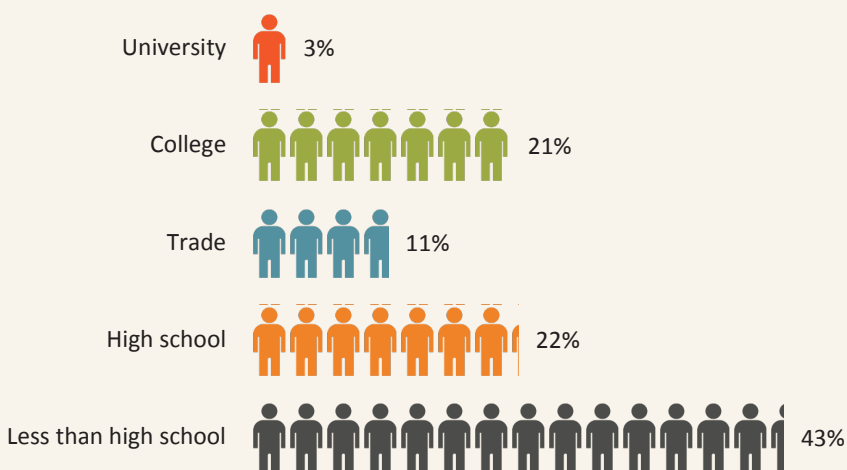
In the community, **815** spoke a **Cree language** in 2016.

### POPULATION BY HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS



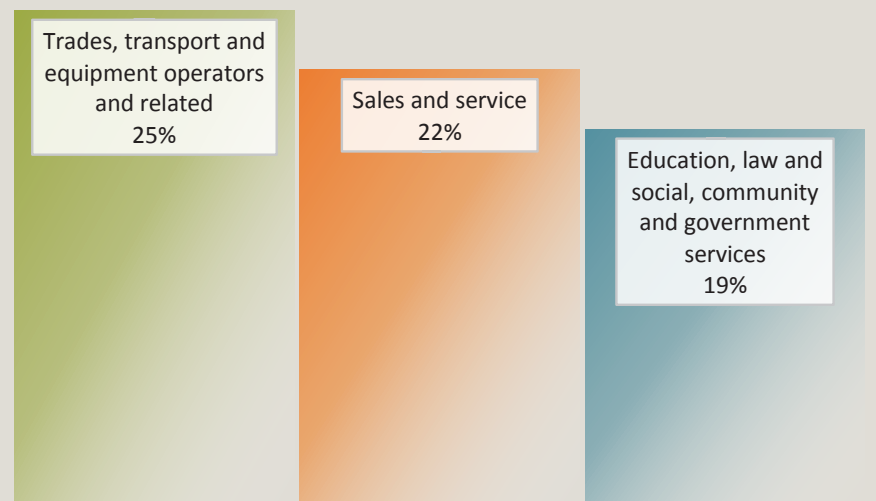
### EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT
